BYLAW 127/2017

A BYLAW TO SET SERVICE FEES FOR SEPTIC SERVICE IN THE RESORT VILLAGE OF CHITEK LAKE IN THE PROVINCE OF SASKATCHEWAN

The council of The Resort Village of Chitek Lake in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts pursuant to the Municipalities Act, to set service fees for septic tank services as follows:

1. For the purpose of this bylaw the expression:
 - a. "Householder" means owner, occupant, lessee or tenant or the person otherwise in charge of any residential or commercial dwelling and also includes the registered owner of the land.
 - b. "Storage or Holding Tank" means a tank constructed of a material that is equivalent to the requirements set out in the Provincial Plumbing Regulations, designed to collect and hold sewage without treatment prior to transporting such waste to a final point of disposal. Minimum 1000-gallon tank is required.
 - c. "Local Government Authority" means the council of the Resort Village of Chitek Lake.
 - d. "Winter Statutory Holidays" means New Year's Day, Good Friday, Victoria Day, Thanksgiving, Remembrance Day, Christmas and Boxing Day.
 - e. "Off Hours" means 5:00 pm to 8:00 pm, weekends (Saturday and Sunday) and winter statutory holidays.
 - f. "Dip" means wastewater lower than 1 foot marked on a measuring stick.
 - g. "Annually" means January 1 to December 31 of any year.
2. The Local Government Authority will provide:
 - a. To each residential householder up to fifty-two (52) pump outs annually and that each pump out shall consist of no less than a dip and no more than one thousand (1000) gallons; and to each

commercial property up to one hundred and four (104) pump outs annually and that each pump out shall consist of no less than a dip and no more than two thousand (2000) gallons.

- b. The local government authority will charge \$15.00 for any pump out that exceeds the one thousand (1000) maximum gallons per call for residential properties and two thousand (2000) gallons per call for commercial properties.
 - c. Only one tank is permitted per base tax property, additional service to extra tanks will be considered as separate tanks.
 - d. Once a household has received 10 or more “dips” they will be charged \$15.00 per dip.
3. Any pump out requested by a householder during off hours or statutory holidays are excluded from the total count of fifty-two (52) for residential and one hundred and four (104) for commercial properties and will be charged as per rates set by the Local Government Authority annually.
4. Once each householder has received fifty-two (52) pump outs, the householder will be billed for all additional pump outs as per rates set by the Local Government Authority annually.
5.
 - a) Service to any householder shall be suspended when the householder is in arrears of payment exceeding three (3) months for off hour service and exceeding the allotted pump outs annually or;
 - b) The outstanding charges shall be added to, and thereby form part of the taxes on the land on which or with respect to which the work is done.
6. That all septic tanks be accessible for the sewer truck, including tree trimmed to prevent damage to septic truck, snow removal to tanks, and to keep vehicles clear of driveways on days when the septic truck is scheduled

or called. Accessible means twenty-five (25) feet from the bottom of the tank to the back of the truck.

7. Bylaws 106/2013 hereby repealed.

8. This bylaw shall come into force on the third reading by Council.
